PRAYER POINTS FROM FRANCES

Chile's new president Sebastian Pifera has asked the country to pray for him and his government as he recognises the enormity of the task of national reconstruction that lies before them. Apart from the strength of the earthquake, its geographical extent was great and happens to correspond to the area in which most of Chile's population [probably more than 90%] lives. So please pray for Chile's new government – and that once things start to look up, they don't forget that they have a very much higher authority to honour and depend on. But it will be a while before things look up! The state alone has an initial estimate of 1.4b. USD. That doesn't include the immense cost of rebuilding of private homes and enterprises. Private homes, unless they are still attached to a bank loan are, more often than not, uninsured. This is not a third world country, but it is not a rich one either. Even the wealthy are not too fond of insurance. The good news is that it appears that the death toll may be less than initially thought. However, the sea still has not returned a number of bodies.
