LETTER FROM FRANCES - My first year Greek students have had their first exam. Not all did well. It has not been an easy year for any of us and that includes the students. Besides earthquakes we have had a run of sicknesses going through the CEP. Please pray for us all. The Chilean government is facing the absolutely massive task of reconstruction after the earthquake. To date most effort has been dedicated to just getting things moving again, kids into schools [many - even some here in Santiago - are in tent or container classrooms], government offices, roads and hospitals functioning at survival level and so on. Now the real task of reconstruction is to begin. Many people are still in tents as winter comes close and to date over 20,000 temporary houses have been built with many more still planned. Only when that is done can the task of actually building houses, working out what help to give to whom and so on can begin. Many thanks for your ongoing support in prayer. *Frances*
